## MAY'S PROGRAM - TWO PRESENTATIONS

## 1. Larry Rhoad's Sopwith Baby project



Our May gathering proved decisively that online meetings are being accepted. With some forty-five attendees signed on, that's not far away from a normal, in-person gathering. So our not-normal times do not seem to be messing with our temporarily normal ones. (Sorry, but I refuse to call any of this

a new normal!)

The program was unique since we had two presenters with two different presentations. First, Larry Rhoads walked us around his new replica Sopwith Baby WW-I biplane, N41LR, with its sexy radial engine. Yes, you read that right: I'm writing this, and I consider radial engines sexy. Get over it! The kit originated with Airdrome Aeroplanes in nearby Holden, MO. Larry described the somewhat unusual parts list (like aluminum tubing for wing ribs), and how the project came together. While a British design, it was painted in U.S. markings with some features relating to his Marine Corps background. The (sexy) nine-cylinder Rotec 3600 engines puts out 150 horsepower and uses scavenge pumps powered by the 12-volt electric system. It features an AOA (angle of attack) system and a full ADS-B package. Larry estimates some 2,600 hours in the build. All in all, it was a most interesting report.

## 2. Mike Dooley on EAA Flight Test Manual and Cards



The second part of the evening was covered by Mike Dooley, who described EAA's Flight Test Manual and Test Cards. Since he recently completed his RV-8 project, Mike wanted to pass along how these two items had helped him during his final preparation and flight testing component.

Developed in 2018 by the Homebuilt Aircraft Council, of which Mike is a member, these elements were designed to help builders through that crucial flight testing phase. With input from test pilots and experienced builders, this program has proven its value even to second owners. It includes transition training and flight test principles. Mike singled out four of the eighteen cards, then explained how each was to be used by the builder. In essence, it allows one to build a complete Pilot's Operating Handbook (POH) as required by FAA regulations. All in all, the manual and cards provide a structure which will help builders and pilots manage the intricate flight-testing maze.

Mike's presentation introduced many of us to a powerful feature we may not have known existed, or if we did, why it was so significant. Well done, Mr. President!

## JUNE'S ONLINE GATHERING INVITATION

We had six extremely well-qualified candidates vying for the prize. Some were in flight training. One is actually building a Sonex. Can you get any more qualified than that? But with six striving for the win, we could only give the nod to one. I have to say, I am SO grateful I was not on that committee. Yes, again this year, it really was a difficult decision.

But the selection was made and EAA HQ was duly notified. The award actually comes from Oshkosh, and we assumed there would be a delay since even EAA is running on a Covid-19 skeleton staff. But in a heartbeat we heard back that our candidate had been approved. So it is with great pride and satisfaction that we report to you our selection for this year's Ray Scholarship is Tucker Thomas.

Tucker is 16 years old and will be in the 11th grade next year. Tucker has been involved with Chapter 91, Aviation Explorers Post 8000, AOPA, Soaring Society of America, and Midwestern Soaring Association. During the last year he soloed in both gliders and powered airplanes and intends to take his flight training at New Century Air Service. ## HANGAR WAITING-LIST APPLICATION PROCESS

Do you have an airplane you'd like to have housed in our Chapter 91 hangars? Are you planning to build (or are building) one and would like to have chapter hangar space? If you're a member, and fulfill the points below, you can be on the list. So if you've ever wondered how to do this, here's the full, unfettered information.

### **Application Process:**

- Requests for hangar space will be made in writing (email, post, or in person) and must include full contact information for the member, the type of aircraft, aircraft status (project or flying), and the date of projected move-in/readiness for hangar space.
- Members applying for hangar space will, in most cases, be placed on a waiting list. Hangar space will be allocated to members on that waiting list based on:
  - Date of application
  - Active participation in chapter activities
  - o Readiness to move into available space
  - Ability to fit the aircraft/project into available space (wingspan, high vs. low wing, etc.).
- Agreements for hangar space will require a simple majority approval of the EAA Chapter 91 Board of Directors.
