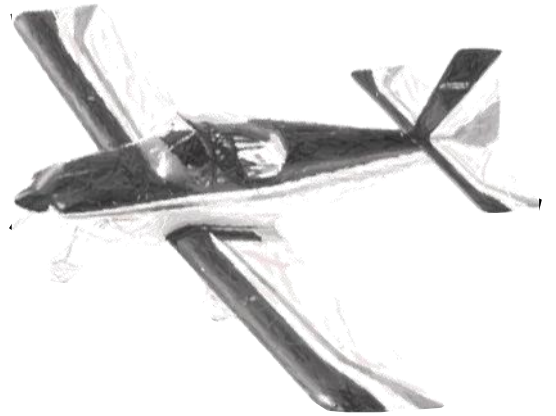

The meeting of EAA Chapter 91 was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by president, Larry Young in the chapter meeting room in the EAA Hangar #1. Rob Schmitt led the gathering in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Larry offered greetings to all members and guests including Terry Christianson and his son Taylor and daughter Alecia; John Clay; and Steve Tyner. The minutes of the September 19 2011 meeting were approved as printed in the October newsletter.

Larry had received a picture of the Ford Tri-Motor autographed by pertinent personnel thanking Chapter 91 for hosting. He also had received a framed plaque from the Exercise Tiger Foundation via the Wright Flight group recognizing Chapter 91 for youth education in aviation.

Pam Ratliff, Secretary/Treasurer provided the balance on hand in the checking account as well as the "holding" account. She said membership badges were available at \$3 each and a "shingle" could be added for \$1.

The next board meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, November 1 at 7 P.M. The next membership meeting would be November 21, 2011 with a program on "Air Traffic Systems in the 21st Century" to be presented by a representative of the air traffic center from Olathe. Larry Young said the progress on the Cessna-on-a-Post was self evident for anyone arriving this evening. Saturday, October 22 at 8 A.M. was scheduled as a time to work on the stainless steel base for members interested in coming out.

Chris St. Germain announced 58 Young Eagles had participated at the October 15 event at Lee's Summit Airport. He encouraged members to contact him with groups interested in the program. He also thought it would be possible for Chapter 91 to sponsor more than one youth to Air Academy in 2012.

Nancy Inderwiesen would take care of cleaning the meeting room before the November meeting. Nancy announced the Kansas City 99's would hold their "Wright Day Dinner" December 4 at the downtown Marriott. The speaker would be Robert Baslee and cost \$50 per person. Phil Ishmael needed a Rotax 912 engine. Larry Young had been notified of 3 Subaru engines available. Pam Ratliff planned to sell her pick-up truck; anyone interested could contact her.

Following a break, the program on powered parachutes was presented by Chapter 868 member, Bob Sundquist and Chapter 91 member, Ed Baucom.

The meeting adjourned, 8:37 P.M.

Program notes: The program this time will be a presentation on Air Traffic Systems in the 21st Century.

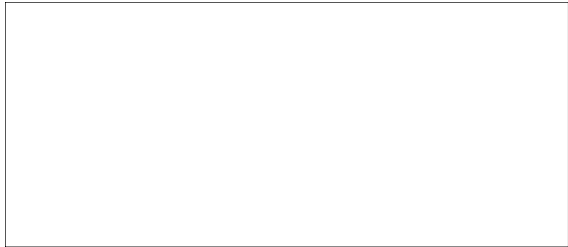
