#### LAST MONTH'S PROGRAM







Do you remember when, at bedtime, your kids would say, "Tell me a story"? I well recall making that request many times myself. (Yes, my *long-term* memory is still okay.) Well, hearing a story was exactly what we got at January's chapter gathering, and it was a great one. Fred Stadler from Chapter 252, filled the roll perfectly. Since Fred flies a 1929 Travel Air at EAA's Pioneer Airport in Oshkosh, he investigated its history. One former owner, Bill Shank, provided Fred more information which involved his father, Bob Shank, who also owned NC648H. And that's where it got interesting.

Bob Shank was born in 1891 in Hurricane, West Virginia, and proved to be a mechanical whiz. He fixed a motorcycle and started making special deliveries for the post office. Ultimately he became a Reo automobile dealer before striking out with a friend to see the rest of the United States. He had seen an airplane a few years earlier, but was more interested in motorcycles. However, at a state or county fair in either Montana or North Dakota, he helped Matty Laird get his plane's engine started and discovered that Laird was earning \$2,000 per week flying at these fairs. For that kind of money, Bob decided he had found his new career.

He needed an airplane and contracted with Max Stupar to build one. The first flights went well except the plane nosed over on landing. After replacing the prop twice, he arranged for two more wheels to be added forward of the existing two, so now landings in the Stupar Tractor airplane were tamed. Bob did not know how to fly but did so anyway. After seeing his initial attempts, Eddie Stinson taught him to fly in less than 3 hours of dual instruction. Ultimately, Bob joined the Stinson School of Flying in San Antonio until he and Eddie started their own – the National School of Flying.

When World War I started, the army recruited Bob as an instructor. Ultimately, he was among the first five civilian pilots to fly for the fledgling U.S. Air Mail Service. In just three years, he was the only pilot of the original group to survive.

Bob Shank went on to more flying achievements and even owned some airports. His story was incredibly interesting and even inspiring. If you did not attend this gathering, you missed a wonderful story.

Have you ever wondered what goes on behind the scenes at AirVenture in Oshkosh? It's a major event, and while it may appear to come together magically, that's not the case. #### **Introduction**

EAA Chapter 91 has invested in a selection of precision tools for the exclusive benefit of its members to build and maintain their aircraft. This document will explain how to get the most of that benefit while protecting the chapter's interest in these valuable assets.

#### **Basic Policy**

- EAA Chapter 91 tools are intended for the exclusive use of EAA Chapter 91 members on personally owned aircraft.
- The EAA Chapter 91 tool crib cabinet is locked except during tool issue or turnin. Keys will be held by Technical Counselors and the chapter president.
- EAA Chapter 91 tools are not to be used in any commercial context. Specifically, they will not be loaned, shared, or rented to non-members, or used by members to provide a commercial service.
- EAA Chapter 91 tools are always the personal responsibility of the borrowing Chapter 91 member, including transit from the Eagle Hangar to the aircraft location and back. Except for normal wear and tear or product malfunction, replacement or repair following loss or damage shall be the responsibility of the borrowing member.
- Technical Counselors will answer members' questions or provide assistance in the use of any Chapter 91- owned tools.

#### **High Dollar Value Tool Policy**

- Members requiring the loan of "High Dollar Value" tools listed in this paragraph will request training from a Technical Counselor.
- A trained "chaperone" will accompany the tool and supervise its proper use and care to ensure the member learns the proper use and care of the tool.
