FLYING START PLANNED

Chapter 91 is planning another Flying Start program for sometime in May or June. AEDs

So it was with a sigh of relief that we recently discovered the appropriate batteries have come back onto the market, and we were able to finalized our order. The only disappointment was that the already exorbitant price had doubled. But at least we will be back up to full strength very soon, just in time for our Young Eagles season.

TRI-MOTOR MIGHT COME TO KLXT

Recently, we were contacted by EAA headquarters inquiring about our willingness to have the Tri-Motor make a stop at the Lee's Summit Municipal Airport in late June. While we are not guaranteed to get it, we are taking measures to accommodate it should that actually happen. One issue of concern is the necessity to use Hangar 1's facilities for overnight storage of the airplane. Hangar 1, formerly privately owned, is now controlled by the city. A call to Joel Arrington, airport manager, indicated the city's willingness to work with us. But it won't be a slam dunk. The city has to coordinate with current Hangar 1 occupants in order to make that happen, and it will require significant logistical adjustments. However, management is willing to work with us since the Tri-Motor always attracts a lot of positive attention for the airport – something it really wants.

Again, we are not guaranteed to get the Tri-Motor even if the city can make the necessary arrangements, but it would be another feather in the chapter's cap if it all worked out. We will keep you posted as the detailed process continues.

Thanks for your generous help, Ed, and heartfelt congratulations to your granddaughter.




