Now that the kitchen is ready we can prep for our first pancake breakfast of 2022 on June 18 from 7:30 till 1 pm at the Eagle Hangar. Nothing happens without volunteers, so put your apron on and get ready to cook / serve up a delicious breakfast!

LAST MONTH'S PROGRAM



The Kansas City area has a rich aviation heritage, one newer citizens may not know much about. MCI, now Charles B. Wheeler Downtown Airport, was once the primary commercial airport for the city. Just north and west was Fairfax Airport which no longer exists, but at one time housed many interesting stories, including numerous mixups involving who was in which pattern. It was also where many MKC-based airplanes would spend the night of December 31 through January 1 in order to take advantage of a Missouri property tax wrinkle. So yes, the history is rather significant. So it was fun to hear from a couple of people whose careers were associated with that history. Melissa Cooper, who spent five years as a manager at MKC is now enjoying her sixth month in a similar position at KCI. And Adam Freeman who replaced her at MKC.

Between the two of them we learned a lot about both airports. One interesting focus was on the arresting system incorporated in modern runways. Those runways literally collapse at the ends when aircraft are unable to stop normally. Even more interesting was who has to pay for the replacement of those collapsed areas in the event they were used. They also discussed the origins of some well-known airport street names including Richards Road and Lou Holland Drive.

During the sixties, MKC held the distinction of being one of the FAA's most dangerous airports. It had something to do with a fairly small space being nestled among a lot of tall buildings and larger, faster airliners starting to encroach on that tight space. The end result, of course, was the construction of MCI several miles to the north.

Both Melissa and Adam are pilots and they discussed their various aviationrelated backgrounds. Adam was on his way to an airline career when 2008 changed the trajectories of many in similar situations. He went on to work in North Dakota for a few years, then returned to the area including managing at Rosecrans Field in St. Joseph. Melissa was quite rightly excited about the new changes coming to MCI which helps explain all the construction taking place up there.

The Lee's Summit Municipal Airport is our home, and while it's ever changing, we still have a tender place in our hearts for it. For many years, John Ohrazda has been the capable manager of this wonderful facility, and has spoken with us often. He will repeat that as our next gathering's speaker on Monday, June 20th. HEDRICK SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

For aviation enthusiasts, the need for financial assistance in the form of scholarships or grants is critical, thanks in no part to the sky-high costs involved. From a personal perspective, I earned my private ticket in 1968 at a cost of a whopping \$1,000. I flew multiple hours almost every day and won the prize in just over thirty days. While that was a lot of money for 1968, it's nothing compared to today's costs. Oh, I'd have killed for a scholarship, but there was nothing. I was lucky enough to have saved up the total cost and was able to pay cash. I was also home on leave from Vietnam, so the time factor worked in my favor. Had now been then, I don't know how I'd have handled it. But at least organizations like EAA, AOPA, and the 99s have stepped up to help.

Chapter 91 has begun developing our own scholarship program. Thanks to the extreme generosity of Phil Hedrick who admired our chapter, we were provided with some heady financial tools to use as we saw fit. The Hedrick Scholarship is the result.

While it's not as robust as some of the others, it is nonetheless extremely helpful. Chapter secretary Rob Schmitt has taken on development of this program and with help from several volunteers, is putting flesh on the bones. While the program is not yet ready to reveal, we do know it is being aimed at a wider spectrum of financial assistance than the others. For example, while most scholarships are totally youth-oriented targeting entry level, ours appears to be aiming more at anyone needing financial assistance in earning aviation-related ratings. Clearly, age is not the sole factor.

Recently, we had the opportunity to see some preliminary documents from this scholarship plan, and have to agree with its scope. We can't reveal more yet, but I will predict when Rob and his group have finalized this creation, it will be something to be proud of. It will also be a legacy to how Chapter 91 and the great Phil Hedrick will help interested and deserving pilots achieve their goals. As the program reaches maturity, we will be happy to pass along the latest information.
